Show & Tell

Brian Carlson

Brian detailed a pirate treasure chest which he built for his nephew. The construction was made from cut 2X4s with ebony stain. A number of large headed brass tacks were used to cover screws and lent a quite attractive appearance. The front panel included a skull and crossbones with an eyepatch. Brian also showed pictures of an old Delta planer which he painted gold and reconfigured into a book press.

Lindsey Smith

Lindsey showed a king-size walnut bed. The foot and head boards each have large floating panels with a carved cross-hatch weave pattern created using a router and various traditional hand carving tools. The project is finished in wipe-on poly and represents well over 100 hours of work.

Tim Grove

Tim described a display board for his wife's ribbons and medals from half and full marathons. The board has 21 mounting pegs for the awards and is emblazoned with the quote "Every Race Has A Story."

Ryan Maly

Ryan presented a distinctive end table made from teak covered plywood. Edges and corners were finished in solid teak and the angled legs were made by Tom Hurst on a lathe from solid blanks. The single drawer has a trapezoidal front shape which is edged with a combination of round-over and 45 degree cuts.
